Stephen Brewer is currently assigned to a Captain's position as the Battalion Operations Officer in the 188th Brigade Support Battalion (BSB). He is responsible for single-handedly creating a medical system for the entire Battalion.

Brewer began his army training in 1993 at Ft, Jackson, SC immediately following high school.

Over the past 15 years, he has received numerous awards and military honors, including Army Commendation Medal; Army Achievement Medal; Army Good Conduct Medal; National Defense Service Medal (2); Global War on Terror Service Medal; Korean Defense Service Medal; NCO Professional development Ribbon; Army Service Ribbon; Overseas Service Ribbon; Physical Fitness Badge; Driver's Badge; multiple Certificates of Achievement, Challenge Coins, and Letters of Commendation.

Brewer has served the Army in many capacities; including a special operations force in South Korea.

In 2000, Brewer earned his BA in Psychology from Shippensburg University, PA, graduating Summa Cum Laude. He went on to earn his Masters in Psychology. He has been active in his work as a human rights activist; creating programs to help the elderly; highlighting the needs for civil rights and advancing the thoughts of Martin Luther King; and working to highlight the need for better mental health facilities.

During this civilian career, his honors have included: Psi Chi National Honors Society, Certificate of Student Research, Dean's List every semester; Sselected for the "National Dean's List" publication; Certificates of Appreciation from Shippensburg University for work with the Social Equity Office; Certificates of Achievement and Completion for training through the Dept. of Public Welfare (DPW); Falls Prevention Program for the Elderly that won the Department of Aging in PA first place award from the national American Public Health Association (APHA).

In 2007, Brewer rejoined the Army and attended Officer Candidate School (OCS) at Ft Benning, GA. He graduated as a Distinguished Military Graduate and was selected to enter the Medical Service Corps branch.
